Objectives

- improve the quality of higher education and enhance its relevance for the labour market and society
- improve the level of competences and skills in HEIs by developing new and innovative education programmes
- enhance the management, governance and innovation capacities, as well as the internationalisation of HEIs
- increase the capacities of national authorities to modernise their higher education systems, by supporting to the definition, implementation and monitoring of reform policies
- foster regional integration and cooperation across different regions of the world through joint initiatives, sharing of good practices and cooperation

Consortium

- Coordinator must be a Higher Education Institution (HEI) and can come from almost all eligible country
- at least 2 HEIs from 2 different Programme Countries
- HEI from Partner Countries ≥ HEI from Programme Countries!!!
 but at least 2 HEI from each Partner Country
- Structural Projects: relevant authority of each targeted Partner Country has to be part

 positive for the project: invite companies & businesses, NGOs, students associations, ...

Project Types

- Joint Projects (JP): focus on the institutional level in the Higher Education

- modernisation of curriculum by developing innovative courses and methodologies
- modernisation of governance, management and functioning of higher education
- strengthening of relations between higher education and the wider economic and social environment
- Structural Projects (SP): focus on the level of the Higher Education systems
 - modernisation of governance, management and functioning of higher education
 - strengthening of relations between higher education and the wider economic and social environment
- + relevant authority of each targeted Partner Country must be involved!





CBHE 2015 - 2018 – Programme Countries

- 2015: in total: 515 applications \rightarrow 452 eligible projects \rightarrow 138 selected projects (= 26,80%)
- 2016: in total: 736 applications \rightarrow 653 eligible projects \rightarrow 147 selected projects (= 19,97%)
- 2017: in total: 833 applications \rightarrow 756 eligible projects \rightarrow 149 selected projects (= 17,89%)
- 2018: in total: 887 applications \rightarrow 874 eligible projects \rightarrow 147 selected projects (= 16,82%)
