PROGRAMMES AND QUALIFICATIONS!

- **1st cycle** Bachelor degree or equivalent, 3 or 4 years of full-time study, 180 and 240 ECTS (with exceptions of studies in medical sciences, which can comprise up to 360 ECTS)
- **2nd cycle** Master degree or equivalent, 1 or 2 years, 60 and 120 ECTS, the first two cycles together account for 300 ECTS
- **3rd cycle** Doctoral degree lasts 3 years and comprises 180 ECTS

111.301 male students enrolled, or 43.4% of the student body; 144.871 female students enrolled, or 56.6% of the student body



Higher Education System in Albania

2003 Bologna Process 2007 Law on Higher Education

The first cycle education programs shall be completed with 180 European credits (ECTS) and their normal duration is 3 academic years;

The second cycle education programs shall be completed with 120 credits, and the normal duration is 2 academic years;

The doctorate education programs last at least 3 academic years and include 60 credits/year.

Higher Education System in Kosovo



Higher Education regulated by the Law on Higher Education adopted in August 2011.

- ☐ First cycle–three (3) to four (4) years of studies by which reaches 180, respectively 240 ECTS =>Bachelor Diploma.
- □ Second cycle one (1) to two (2) years of studies after completion of the first level by which the students reaches 60, respectively 120 ECTS => Master Diploma.
- ☐ Third cycle-doctoral studies with academic and independent research scientific character

Any other post-secondary education in the levels 5,6,7 and 8 of the European Qualification Framework for Lifelong learning for which credits may be given (ECTS)

Still not officially joined the Bologna Process!

Higher Education System in Montenegro



Hgher Education system concentarted in the capital city of Montenegro – Podgorica.

- Member of Bologna process as of 2003
- Study programmes organized at three levels:
 - Undergraduate (180 ECTS)
 - Postgraduate (120 ECTS)
 - Doctoral (180 ECTS)

Higher education institutions, licensed and accredited in accordance with the Law on Higher Education can be: public or private. HEIs include: university, faculty, art academy and college.

One public and three private HEIs in Montenegro as well as one independent public faculty and four independent private faculties.



Some recommendations for CBHE project proposals!

- → Pay particular attention to the eligibility criteria (e.g. minimum number of HEIs in consortia);
- → Insist on cost-effectiveness, wider impact, and sustainability of results especially in respect of target groups (and bearing in mind project budget);
- → Insist on the need to empower the Partner Country partners from the early stages of the proposal preparation;
- → Be innovative in the content and methodologies described in your application
- → Capacity/level of institutions for addressing certain topics of the projects
